REPRODUCTION OF WAR MEMORIAL.

THE MEMORIAL, DESIGNED AND EXECUTED BY MR. F. ARNOLD WRIGHT, R.B.S., IS IN THE FORM OF A BRONZE MURAL TABLET, SURMOUNTED BY A GROUP SYMBOLIZING SEA POWER. STANDING ON A BOAT PROW FLANKED BY SHIPS, BEFORE A BACKGROUND OF THE SETTING SUN, BRITANNIA, WITH UPRAISED SHIELD, BEARS THE FLAG.

INSCRIBED ON A CENTRAL PANEL OF GREEN CONNEMARA MARBLE ARE THE NAMES OF THE MEMBERS OF THE SOCIETY'S STAFF WHO FELL, THE DESIGN BEING COMPLETED WITH A TROPHY OF MILITARY EMBLEMS AT THE BASE.
